Recently you received a letter from the State of Arizona (Arizona Department of Health Services) about changes they made to the drug assistance program called ADAP. The ADAP program is reducing the number of free medications. This change is effective **July 1, 2009**.

This change may mean that you will need to pay for some of your medications. Attachment A is a list of ADAP medications you have received. This list will tell you what medications are free and what medications you may have to buy after June 30th.

Because you are a patient the McDowell Clinic, if you will need to buy some of these medications, MIHS has a plan to help you. MIHS enrolled you in its CopaCare Plan so you can buy medications at a lower rate. CopaCare is a plan that offers lower priced medications based on your income. This plan allows you to get some medications at MIHS pharmacies for less money. You can buy the medications from any of our nine pharmacies (See Attachment B).

To use an MIHS Pharmacy, please:

1. Call the pharmacy of your choice with the following information:
 - Tell the Pharmacy staff you see a doctor at McDowell Clinic.
 - Patient Name
 - Address
 - Date of Birth
 - List of medications to be filled
2. Ask the pharmacy staff any questions you may have.
3. Have the pharmacy call Apothecary Shoppe to transfer the prescription or contact your physician directly.
4. Pick up and pay for your medication. You may pay with:
 - Cash
 - Check
 - Debit card
 - Credit card
5. Allow 48 hours before picking up your medication.
